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Click on the top bar or anywhere in the file. Hit Ctrl+A then Ctrl+C to select and copy the entire contents of the file.

Copy the contents then click create.

SRT to Text Online Converter

SRT To Text Online Converter is a useful tool for those who want to take advantage of the closed caption information provided by YouTube to create a transcript of a video. This free online converter does not require any software installations.

To create a transcript for your video, you need to download closed caption information from YouTube and then follow these easy steps:

- 1. Copy the URL of your video in YouTube and follow this link to create and download the raw SRT file of your video.
- Open your downloaded SRT file in Notepad and copy its entire contents to clipboard (maximum character size: 5000).
- 3. Paste the copied text into the box below and click "CREATE TRANSCRIPT."
- 4. Once you have finished, you can fine tune your transcript file. Transcript stripped of stopwords can be useful to make a list of keywords to optimize your video for search engines or in the "Description" field on Youtube Video Manager page or video webpage on your website.
- 5. OPTIONAL: click Get Keywords to view list of most frequent words that occur in your transcript (highlighted in purple).





Super EASY, right? But wait....

What does it mean to have accessible videos? Have you ever heard of WCAG? WCAG stands for web content accessibility guidelines. These are standards published by the Web Accessibility Initiative of the World Wide Web Consortium. This was an international consortium tasked with determining what people with disabilities need to make the web truly accessible. There are three levels of compliance: A, AA, and AAA. For level A, you need to have synchronized captions and either descriptive text transcript or audio description audio track. But closed captions and transcripts benefit all viewers! The results from a national study tabulated the perceived benefits of closed captions through comments from students. Most often referenced was learning aids as a perceived benefit for closed captions at . % and it was an even higher perceived benefit for transcriptions at . % as a learning aid. So who else is involved with accessibility? Quality Matters is an organization that provides standards for course design. Quality Matters rubric standard. outlays: the course should provide alternative means of access to course materials in formats that meet the needs of diverse learners. So let's get started creating closed captions and transcriptions with an efficient process.
